TOWN OF CLINTON REGULAR BOARD MEETING

July 16, 2024

The regular meeting of the Town of Clinton was called to order by Chairman Peter Ramfjord at 6:05 PM with Supervisors Cal Warwas, Peter Ramfjord, Treasurer Elaine Santi, Fire Chief Jim Theodore, EMR Coordinator Kyle Tomczyk and Clerk Brian Mayry. Supervisor Robert Butler was absent. All in attendance recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were distributed by the Clerk. Supervisor Warwas motioned to wave reading the minutes and accept the minutes as distributed, second by Chaiman Ramfjord. Motion carried unanimously.

The Treasurer's Report was provided and read by Treasurer Santi. Chaiman Ramfjord motioned to accept the financial report, second by Supervisor Warwas and unanimously carried.

Chairman Ramfjord motioned to pay the submitted bills and claim forms. The motion was second by Supervisor Warwas and prevailed unanimously.

Todd Lauer addressed the Township Board regarding the status of the Relief Association. Currently the relief association has an unfunded liability of approximately \$ 12,000 but no additional contribution is required. Chaiman Ramfjord motioned that a monthly \$2,500 municipal contribution be made until the liability is funded. The motion was seconded by Supervisor Warwas and unanimously approved.

Fire Chief Theodore stated the Department responded to six department alarms. Chief Theodore addressed the Township Board stating that there is another round of NFPA training beginning this fall and we have one enrolled so far. The Department is looking for guidance on addressing the filling of swimming pools in the community. There was a brief discussion and was decided that the fire department should not be taking trucks out of service to fill pools. The new 2025 OSHA standards were touched on briefly. Chief Theodore stated that he is looking at using Lexipol for the Departments SOPs.

EMR Coordinator Kyle Tomczyk stated that the EMRs received 8 alarms. Kyle stated that he is working on providing quarterly trainings options. Grant opportunities are being sought personal CO monitors. Training for medication delivery will be held at the end of the month. The EMS supply locker is organized, inventoried and inventory levels will be tracked with the help of all responders.

Chairman Ramfjord stated the baseball fields are being used by the local youth baseball program. The Township roads are graded. Chaiman Ramfjord motioned that chloride be applied to the roads as soon as practical. The motion was seconded by Supervisor Warwas and unanimously approved.

Clinton Township Resolution 24-03, Resolution Appointing Election Judges, was presented by Clerk Mayry. Supervisor Ramfjord motion to accept the resolution. The motion was seconded by Supervisor Warwas and unanimously approved.

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Chairman Ramfjord motioned that the meeting be adjourned until the next regular meeting on August 20, 2024, beginning at 6:00 PM. Supervisor Warwas second and the meeting adjourned at 7:30 PM.
