TOWN OF CLINTON REGULAR BOARD MEETING

October 22, 2024

The regular meeting of the Town of Clinton was called to order by Chairman Peter Ramfjord at 6:10 PM with Supervisors Cal Warwas, Peter Ramfjord, Robert Butler, Treasurer Elaine Santi, Fire Chief Jim Theodore, EMR Coordinator Kyle Tomczyk and Clerk Brian Mayry. All in attendance recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were distributed by the Clerk. Supervisor Butler motioned to wave reading the minutes and accept the minutes as distributed, second by Chaiman Ramfjord. Motion carried unanimously.

The Treasurer's Report was provided and read by Treasurer Santi. Supervisor Butler motioned to accept the financial report, second by Chaiman Ramfjord and unanimously carried.

Supervisor Butler motioned to pay the submitted bills and claim forms. The motion was second by Chairman Ramfjord and prevailed unanimously.

Fire Chief Theodore stated the Department responded to one department alarm. Chief Theodore addressed the Township Board stating NFPA training is now testing Firefighter I. The new 2025 OSHA standards were touched on briefly, Chief Theodore will be attending a OSHA class to learn more about the coming changes. The grant applications for the AFG grants were unsuccessful. Chief Theodore stated that one of the grant applications was for turn out gear. A majority current turnout gear is nearing its ten-year life cycle and is in need of replacement. Chief Theodore estimated the cost of replacing all turnout gear to be around the \$70,000 area. Chairman Ramfjord asked that pricing be sought out from several vendors and a plan to replace the turnout gear will develop from there. Grants are being written to the Elks for fire prevention material and another to MN Power for equipment.

EMR Coordinator Kyle Tomczyk stated that the EMRs received 12 alarms, four of which were in McDavitt Township. The group is working on staying current and providing quality service. Kyle is also working on pricing for CO monitors to be carried by responders. Daniel Jude is seeking membership for Clinton EMR as he is EMT certified. Chaiman Ramfjord motioned to the policy, second by Supervisor Butler and unanimously carried.

Treasurer Santi presented Township Purchasing and Reimbursement Policy. Supervisor Butler motioned to the policy, second by Chaiman Ramfjord and unanimously carried.

Chairman Ramfjord motioned that the meeting be adjourned until the next regular meeting on October 22, 2024, beginning at 6:00 PM. Supervisor Warwas second and the meeting adjourned at 6:53 PM.
