TOWN OF CLINTON REGULAR BOARD MEETING

May 20, 2025

The regular meeting of the Town of Clinton was called to order by Chairman Robert Butler at 6:00 PM with Supervisors Peter Ramfjord, Jacob Shavor, Treasurer Elaine Santi, Clerk Brian Mayry and Fire Chief Jim Theodore. All in attendance recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were distributed by the Clerk. Chairman Ramfjord motioned to wave reading the minutes and accept the minutes as distributed, second by Supervisor Shavor. Motion carried unanimously.

The Treasurer's Report was provided by Treasurer Santi. Supervisor Ramfjord motioned to accept the financial report, second by Chairman Butler and unanimously carried.

Chairman Butler motioned to pay the submitted bills and claim forms. The motion was second by Supervisor Shavor and prevailed unanimously.

Supervisor Ramfjord stated that the roads were inspected and Santi, Mayry and Borg Roads could use some brushing. Supervisor Ramfjord will take care of getting that work done. The roads will be graded and treated for dust as soon as possible. Work has begun on the Harju Road turn around. James Shavor from Holmes Recycling stated that the water trailer/tank was inspected by a MNDOT inspector and is safe for use. Special thanks to James Shavor of Holmes Recycling for t-ball field dug out roof repair.

Fire Chief Theodore gave an overview of the latest runs and an overview of the department's current business. The department responded to eight fire department alarms and 11 EMS runs. The next round of Assistance to Firefighter Grants (AFG) is opening in July and the Board recommends the fire department apply for the available grants with a 5% match. The Department has been staffing standby with the J-5 for MN DNR response. Several firefighters responded with Engine 6 to the Brimson Complex Fires on May 15th. Chief Theodore requested that those firefighters responding to large federal events be paid \$30.00 per hour for their efforts. The gravel pad for the water tanker is complete. The MN DNR has a semi tractor potentially available to the department to tow the new water tanker; more information will be available on this coming soon. Supervisor Shavor motioned to pay firefighters serving on large federal wildfire events be paid \$30.00 per hour as long as the reimbursements cover the wages. The motion was second by Chairman Butler and prevailed unanimously.

Resolution authorizing contract with interested officer under Minn. Stat. 471.88, subd. 5 were completed by Supervisors Ramfjord and Shavor to allow them to perform work that is outside of the work of an elected official. Chairman Butler motioned to accept the signed resolutions under Minn. Stat. 471.88, subd. 5. The motion was second by Supervisor Ramfjord and prevailed unanimously.

Supervisor Ramfjord motioned that the meeting be adjourned until the next regular meeting on May 20, 2025, beginning at 6:00 PM, the Annual Road Inspection to take place beginning at 5:00 PM leaving from the Clinton Community Building. Chairman Butler second and the meeting adjourned at 6:55 PM.
